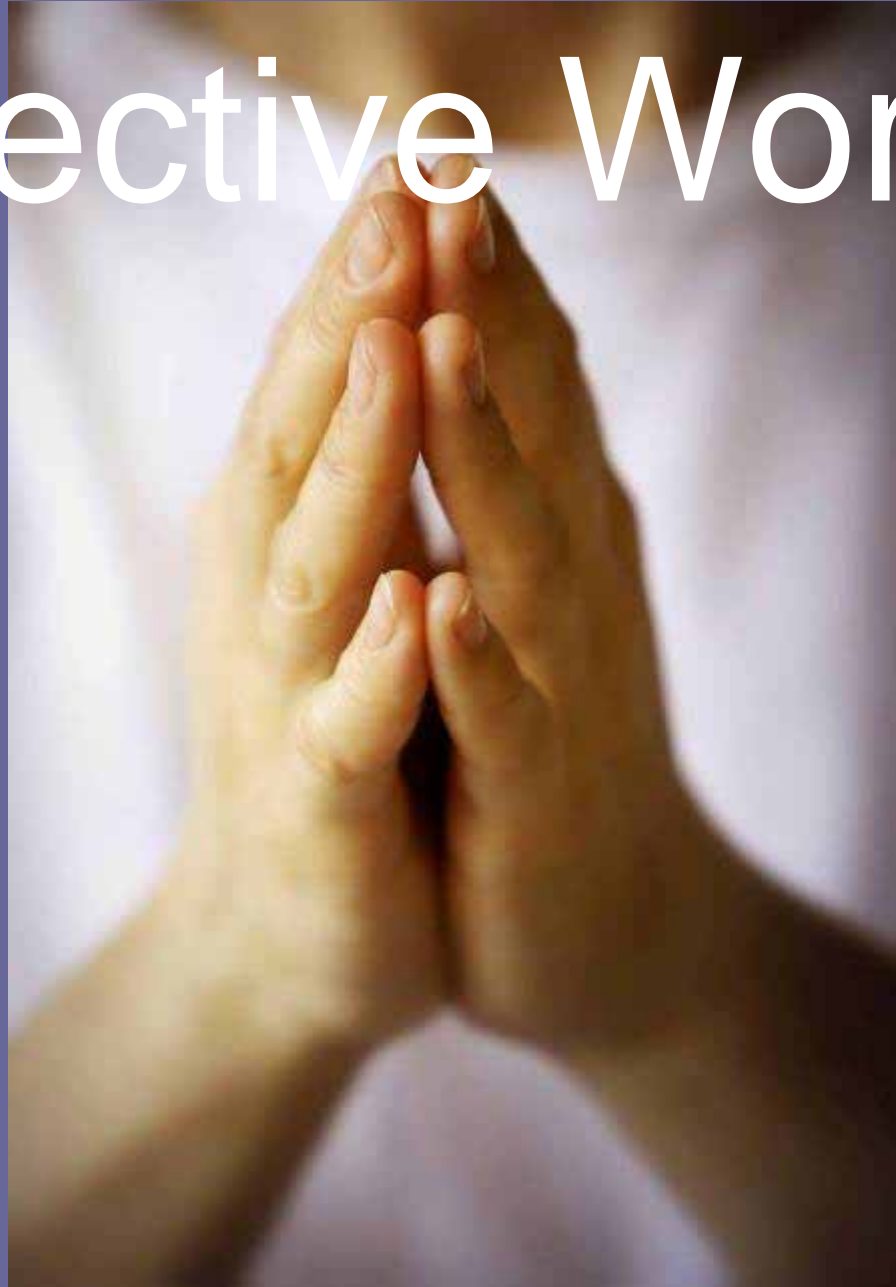


Collective Worship

To offer the experiences and opportunities which allow children to explore various aspects of worship, and encourage a development of the spiritual dimension of the child's life.

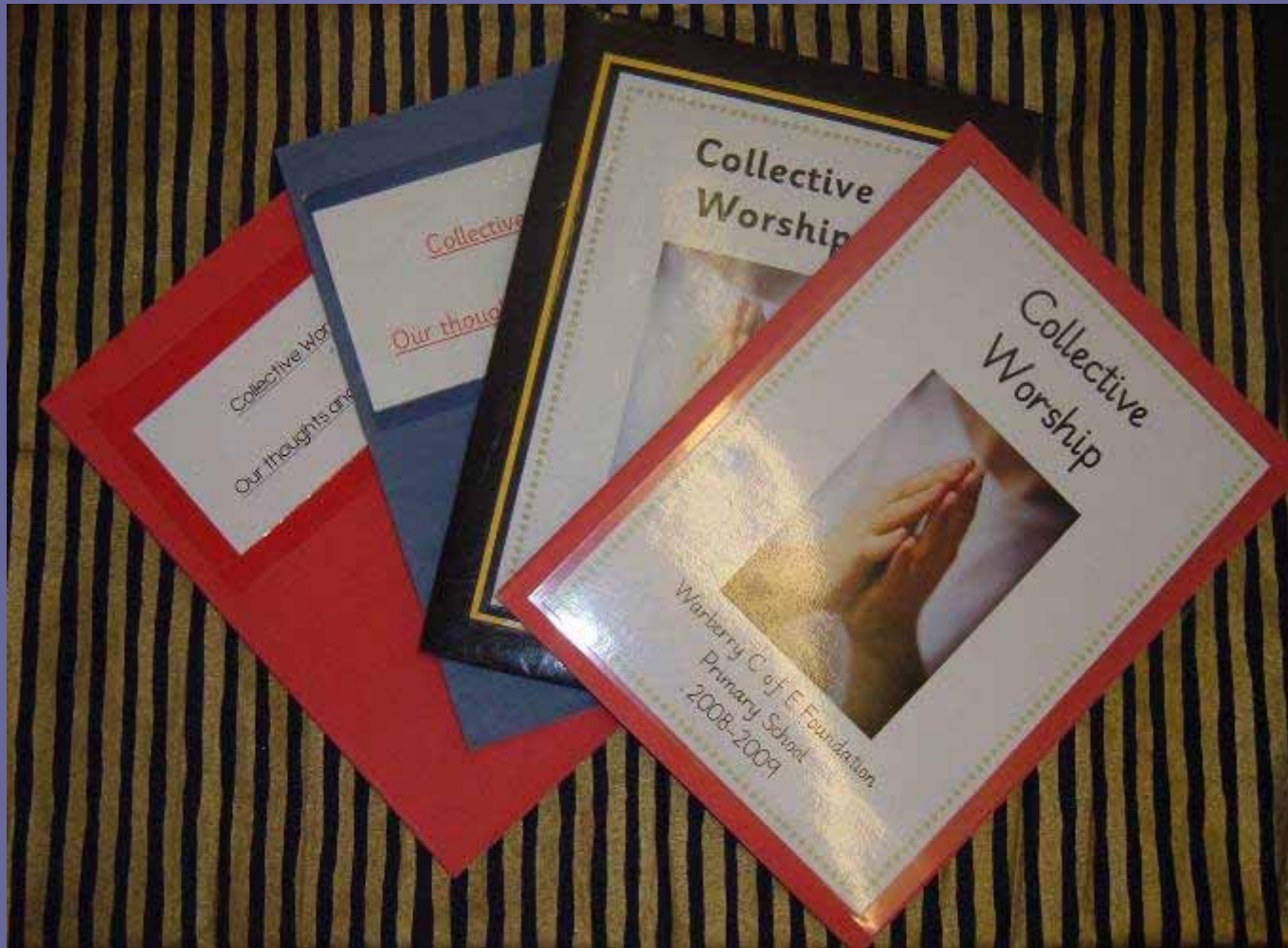
To encourage children to develop a sense of awe and wonder about the world around them

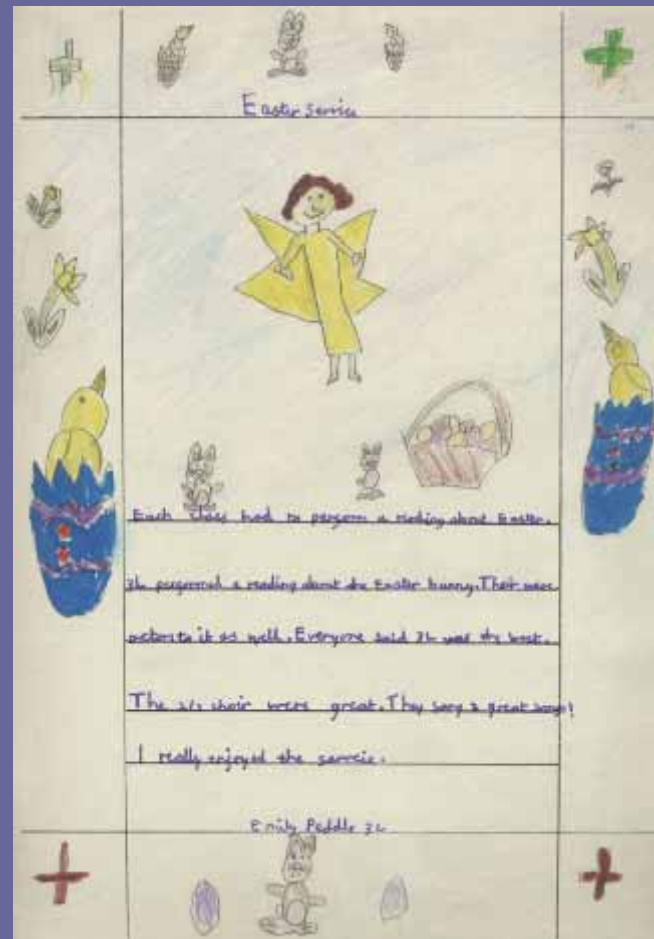
The clear vision with which the headteacher leads the school.

Visitors to Warberry

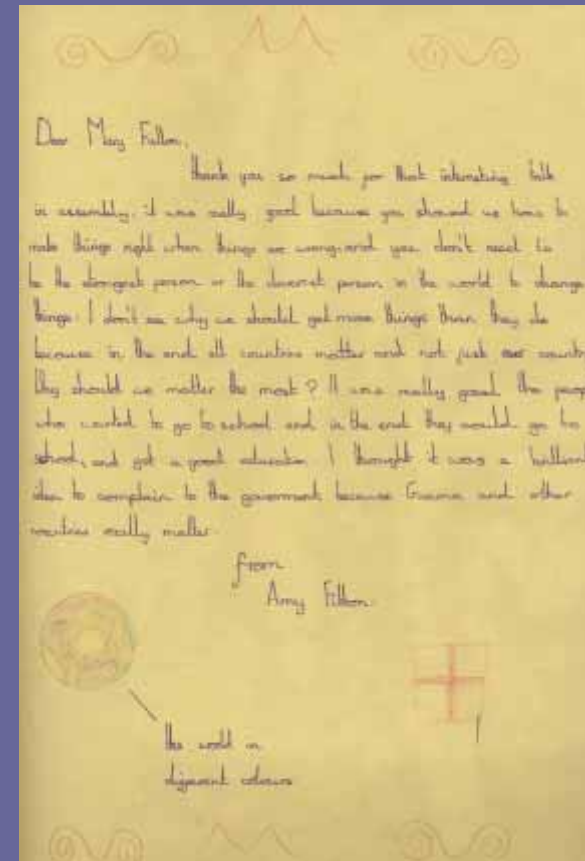
Every Tuesday a visitor from St Matthias Church leads an assembly with either KS2 or KS1 and Reception

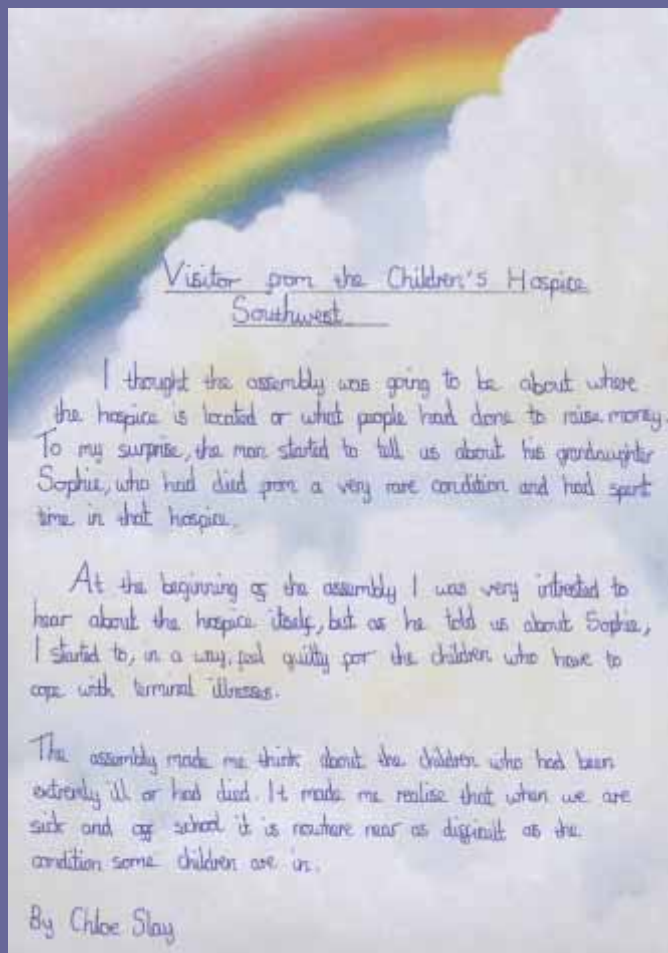
